He bought a white leisure suit, some gold chains, elevator shoes, and dedicated his every waking moment to the pursuit of female companionship. Larry's PC debut (in Sierra's *Land of the Lounge Lizards*) proved to be one of the most popular fantasy games of 1987, and a boon to adults who were burned out on sword-wielding hobbits.

Now Larry's back and wants to find his ideal partner and (gasp!) *settle down*. Sounds like "Mission Impossible," right? Hey, give the guy a break! Larry can't help it if his incredible social maladroitness keeps getting him into embarrassing, humiliating, dangerous, and hysterically funny situations.

Larry confronts a pistol-packin' Southern Belle in a "Quickie Mart" and vies for the affections of the lovely Barbara Bimbo on a tacky TV game show. You can adjust the game's "filth level" from prudish to raunchy, but Larry II is truly adult satire, not soft-core PC porn. Not many kids would find the game all that funny — or even comprehensible. *Larry II* is inventive, sly, exasperating, engrossing, and even a little bit smug. There are marvelous graphics, too, of the day-glow type favored by Sierra.
